HISTORY OF HOSPITALITY CORNER

It all began in a cupboard on the top floor of the Western Division of our Montreal General Hospital. That is now the Montreal Children's Hospital - but, when our Auxiliary began, it was our headquarters. It was there that someone noticed that the nurses, in their traditional pink, blue, or white uniforms, were all too often having to scurry out to buy new white stockings because even a narrow run showed very clearly.

It's fun to imagine the Board meeting where the new Auxiliary decided to undertake a whole new service - to have white stockings available for nurses.

Next came serving coffee and tea and even toast with a double slice toaster! We felt we were rivals of the Ritz Café.

Another memory: the earliest, eager if inexperienced volunteer buyers, totally unaware that there was any particular difference between "Wholesale" and "Retail", spotted some attractive items in an American Gift Shop. Full of enthusiasm, she bought a selection to add tempting variety to our own display. Not much profit there! Further, there was import duty to be added. However, the newly informed buyer apologized and graciously made a gift of it all to Hospitality Corner.

Hospitality Corner is filled with memories and laughter and heart-warming reports. Probably that is why it has continued to grow, as that first cupboard did, expanding more than once into adjacent space.

And that space is filled with variety and imagination. No more white stockings but toys, purses, stationery, scarves, bed jackets and the big seller - jewelry. Not to be forgotten is good food. Altogether, our shop can now be considered a four-part operation. There is the Gift Shop, the Snack Bar (including the Cedar & Pine Cafes) and the Catering Service with its ever-increasing clientele. As for number four, the traveling wagons bring shop selections to a patient's rooms as permitted. They also carry sundries such as tooth paste, toothbrushes, soap etc. for patients' needs, some transported, perhaps by a wagon labeled "Lou-Mobile"! That's another delightful Hospitality Corner story!

All in all, it is understandable why Hospitality Corner can report a satisfactory profit for the past year. Pleasant results, considering the shortage of volunteers has meant needing more professional help, along with opening for shorter hours. Nevertheless, \$31,000 was donated to the Research Institute and \$300,000 has been donated to The Auxiliary for patient care and new equipment. It forms the major percent of your Auxiliary's contribution to the Hospital for 2012-13. The continuing variety of stock, along with the shortage of special voluntary help explains why, this year, the Early Bird Show will not take place. It was started when two regular buyers went to New York and had such a successful two days of purchasing - wholesale - that they longed for space in which to show customers what was available, reminding them to do their Christmas shopping early. It was another happy success in its prime - but now the showing will take place within the more spacious Shop itself.

By the way, remembering the first servings of tea and coffee, it is of interest to know that our waitresses in the Snack Bar and Cafes receive tips. These all go to the MUHC Research Institute and since the custom began in 1984 well over half a million dollars has been donated!
